What does God's Word say about Pride?

Proverbs 16:18 *Pride goes before destruction, and a haughty spirit before the fall.*

Proverbs 26:12 Do you see a man who is wise in his own eyes? There is more hope for a fool than for him.

James 4:6-9 "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble." ⁷ Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. ⁸ Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded.
