Misinterpretation #4: God's Favor can be <u>earned</u> through our Good Works

4. God's favor is given freely to <u>bankrupt</u> sinners who look to Jesus' unfathomable <u>grace</u>.

Matthew 9:10-13

Ask: How will I depend on Jesus to do what I can't do?


Read Matthew 5:17-20 is there anything in this passage that stirs your heart?

- ➤ Read Matthew 5:19 What is Jesus saying is the best way to learn and teach the Bible? Is this the way we do it? What needs to change in how you learn the Bible? What is the danger of learning without doing what we learn?
- Read Matthew 9:10-13 What is the difference between the Pharisee's and the Tax Collectors? Why does Jesus accept the tax collectors and not the Pharisees?

Sermon on the Mount "Fulfillment of The Law" MATTHEW 5:17- 20

Sermon on the Mount is an invitation into Jesus' Kingdom:

- A Society where Jesus is <u>King</u> and we are not
- A Society where its citizens imitate and reflect the <u>heart</u> of Jesus

Jesus is <u>essential</u> to how we read and experince the <u>Bible</u>

Why is reading the Bible correctly so important?

- 1. When we miss interpret the Bible we miss the <u>heart</u> of Jesus
- 2. When we miss the heart of Jesus, we miss the <u>life</u> Jesus died for us to live

How are we to read and understand the Bible?

Matthew 5:17

¹⁷ "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them.

Misinterpretation #1: The OT is for Israel, The NT is for Christians

- 1. Jesus is the central Redemptive Story throughout the whole Bible
- ➤ Ask: Where is Jesus in this scripture?

Matthew 5:18

For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished.

Misinterpretation # 2: We are no longer under the <u>Law</u> but under Grace

- 2. We are under <u>Jesus</u>: His Word accomplishes the transformation of our <u>hearts</u> not just our <u>behavior</u>
- Ask: How is Jesus' heart displayed in this scripture?
 - **Jeremiah 31:31** "Behold, the days are coming, declares the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah... I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts. And I will be their God, and they shall be my people.

Matthew 5:19

Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven.

Misinterpretation #3: We can learn & teach the bible without <u>living it</u>

- 3. TThe only way to learn & teach the Bible is to live it
- Ask: How can I live out the heart of Jesus behind this scripture?
